The LGBTQ+ Question

When the General Assembly gathers next month in Halifax, final steps will be taken on a path leading to change in The Presbyterian Church in Canada forever. Commissioners will be asked to receive and approve the parallel definitions of marriage, and to approve the ordination of gay clergy. While there will also be clear statements concerning freedom of conscience and graceful dismissal, the Church will have moved in what is for many of its people a very controversial direction. Much work has been done to adjust our governing documents, including Living Faith, and this work will also be introduced for final approval and implementation.

The Presbyterian Church in Canada holds two parallel definitions of marriage and recognizes that faithful, Holy Spirit filled, Christ centered, God honouring people can understand marriage as a covenant relationship between a man and a woman or as a covenant relationship between two adult persons; AND that congregations, sessions, ruling and teaching elders be granted liberty of conscience and action on marriage.

Part of the definition of Reformed theology that The Presbyterian Church in Canada holds stems from the Protestant Reformation of the 16th Century. But another important part is that we are committed to continually reform our theology as our understanding of God's purpose in the world deepens. This means that when we say God is the same today as since the beginning of time, we also say God includes everyone – everyone – in the grand design of creation. Eternal life is available to whosoever believes in God and comes by the grace of God through our faith in Him.

The LGBTQ+ Question (con't)

And God does not make mistakes.

Further, the Church will also formally permit the ordination of Elders and Ministers who are in samesex marriages.

Friends, this important decision has the potential to either damage the Church or to strengthen it. Let us pray only that we may welcome this change without fear, and that God's will be done in this as in all things.


