# **January 2024 - John Calvin**

This article begins a description of one of the most influential characters in the Protestant Reformation and his contribution to the modern-day Church. It is a huge task and will probably demand more than one Newsletter to present. So here goes...

John Calvin - also known in his native France as Jean Cauvin - along with Martin Luther in Germany, Erasmus in the Netherlands, John Knox in Scotland and Savonarola in Italy, sought to correct what they regarded as imbalances in the life of the church. The major thrust of these Reformers was to return the church to the practice and theology of the Bible, and particularly to that of the New Testament.

During his time of influence, Calvin also returned the language of worship to that of the people; introduced the sermon; demanded the weekly celebration of Communion and the singing of the Psalms as a major parts of Sunday worship. He also explained that there were two essential parts of the Christian life: (1) the love of righteousness, and (2) the following of the rules that conform us to Christ:

- 1. that we may devote ourselves to God.
- 2. that we may seek to serve God and neighbour.
- 3. that we may patiently bear the cross; and,
- 4. that we may know in what manner we ought to use the present life and its material benefits.

He wrote, "Necessity demands that we possess all things as though we possessed them not; that we bear poverty with mildness, and abundance with moderation."

### January 2024 - John Calvin (cont'd)

In his various documents, Calvin worked in a state or national church setting. This resulted in the call that we acknowledge each other as brothers and sisters in Christ and live in a mutually supportive manner for the good of society. In his day, not only was each citizen a member of a city or nation state, but each citizen was also a member of the church that was established by law within that city or state. Each citizen therefore had an obligation to conduct their affairs in a Christian way. For one thing, taking a stand against the teachings of the state church became equated with treason against the state itself, thus leading to some of the more distasteful events that took place throughout the Reformation period, such as the various wars of religion and the persecution of dissenters.


